**1. CALL TO ORDER**

The meeting was called to order at 4:12 p.m.

**3. BUSINESS**

- 3.1 Application for Zoning By-Law Amendment (Planning File No. D14-10 03)  
Geary: 16 Poplar Crescent, Red Lake.

Mayor: Thank you for attending this public meeting. Planning Administrator: Read the Public Meeting Notice (as attached). She also noted that the Planning Advisory Committee defeated a motion to approve the Zoning By-Law Amendment, and instead recommended that the property owners consider an application for a temporary use provision. She further advised that should the applicants change their application to a temporary use provision, the Planning Department would consider that the required application fee has been paid. Notice of the application has been circulated, and consideration to approve a Temporary Use By-Law could be given at a subsequent Council Meeting.

The Applicants questioned why the Temporary Use By-Law is being recommended and noted that there are several commercial businesses in the area already. The Planning Administrator reported the Planning Advisory Committee had concerns with the potential growth of the business and considered that a full functioning business may be better suited in a commercial situation. The Applicants were advised that if they wished to continue with the laundry service in the same area for a longer period of time they can apply for an extension.
